### Introduction

The objective of our courses is to provide specialized education as a foundation for research and professional enhancement. We seek to equip our students to meet the international requirements both at foreign universities and international law firms.

Our students are required to attend classes, seminars, and in certain courses, laboratory sessions. The assessment pattern includes original research work and requires the writing of a supervised dissertation.

At the end of the course a student is required to take an online exam. All the questions are generally problem based.



A student having minimum **70 percent attendance** will be allowed to take the final exam.

For successfully completing a course, a student must obtain at least 40% marks in each level of assessment i.e Research Work (Submission), Research Work (Presentation), Dissertation,

Group Discussion and Final Examination.

If the student fails to achieve the minimum marks, he will not be eligible for certification. **Such a student can take re-exam in the month of July 2011 by paying a re-exam fee of Rs. 1500/- per course.**

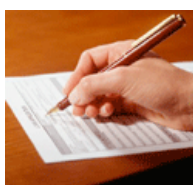
### ASSESSMENTS

#### Research Work (Submission):

This carries a maximum of 60 marks, of which a student must obtain at least 24 marks in order to pass the course.

#### Research Work (Presentation):

This carries a maximum of 40 marks, of which a student must obtain at least 16 marks in order to pass the course.



**Dissertation:** This carries a maximum of 80 marks, of which a student must obtain at least 32 marks in order to pass the course.

**Group Discussion:** This carries a maximum of 20 marks, of which a student must obtain at least 8 marks in order to pass the course.

**Final Examination:** This carries a maximum of 100 marks, of which a student must obtain at least 40 marks in order to pass the course.



## Plagiarism and Intellectual Honesty

The management of Asian School of Cyber Laws & ASCL Law School has adopted special procedures and regulations for dealing with intellectual honesty. These will be strictly enforced.

It has been noted that many students are not aware of what constitutes plagiarism – the unacknowledged use of another person's words or ideas or submitting the same assignment for different courses.

Our examiners may want references for a variety of reasons: they may wish to evaluate the credibility of the sources for themselves or to see the information in its original context.

So, anything you quote, paraphrase, or cite as expert opinion to support your own ideas should be documented. It is not necessary to document well-known facts, proverbs, or quotations.

Facts should be referenced if they are not common knowledge or if they may be disputed.

In case of any doubt(s) with respect to the academic honesty or how to refer to another's work, please be sure to discuss these with your teacher / counselor / faculty member / supervisor / mentor for the dissertation.
